Bible Verse: Obey me and I will be your God, and you will be my people.
Walk in all the ways I command you that it may go well with you. Jeremiah 7:23

Keeping a Promise is Important:

As a result of his faith and obedience to all of God's commands, he received God's promise of great nation, great name and great blessings.
